## **ENGLISH LANGUAGE**

Implemented from the Year of Examination 2025

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### PURPOSE OF EXAMINATION

The purpose of the examination is to assess the candidates' attainment in English Language based on the Learning Outcomes stated in the *English Language Teaching and Learning Syllabus 2020 (Primary)*. The Learning Outcomes form the basis for the assessment objectives listed on page 3.

### **ASSESSMENT OBJECTIVES**

In the English Language examination, candidates will be assessed on their ability to:

#### In Paper 1 (Writing)

- AO1 write effectively to suit purpose, audience and context, using accurate and appropriate vocabulary, grammar, punctuation and spelling
- AO2 generate and select relevant ideas, organising and expressing them in a coherent and cohesive manner

#### In Paper 2 (Language Use and Comprehension)

- AO1 show understanding of a variety of written and multimodal texts at the literal, inferential and evaluative levels
- AO2 use vocabulary, grammar, punctuation and spelling appropriately in context

#### In Paper 3 (Listening Comprehension)

AO1 show understanding of a variety of spoken texts at the literal, inferential and evaluative levels, including the identification of main ideas and details

#### In Paper 4 (Oral Communication)

- AO1 read aloud fluently and expressively with clear and accurate pronunciation to suit purpose, audience and context
- AO2 express personal opinions, ideas and experiences clearly and appropriately to engage the listener
- AO3 speak fluently, with clear pronunciation and grammatical accuracy, using a range of appropriate vocabulary and structures

#### Paper 1 (Writing)

<u>Part 1 (Situational Writing</u>): Candidates write a short functional piece (e.g., letter, email, report) to suit the purpose, audience and context of a given situation.

<u>Part 2 (Continuous Writing</u>): Candidates write a composition of at least 150 words in continuous prose on a given topic. Three pictures will be provided on the topic offering different angles of interpretation. The composition must be based on at least one of these pictures.

#### Paper 2 (Language Use and Comprehension)

This paper comprises 25 multiple-choice questions and 50 open-ended questions which assess candidates' ability to use language appropriately in context and to comprehend a variety of written and multimodal texts at the literal, inferential and evaluative levels.

#### Paper 3 (Listening Comprehension)

This paper comprises 20 multiple-choice questions which assess candidates' ability to comprehend spoken English. The tasks may be based on a variety of types of audio texts, e.g., texts that recount, entertain, instruct, describe, inform, explain, respond, argue, evaluate and/or persuade. Graphic representations will be used for the first seven items. Each text will be read twice. Time will be given for candidates to read the questions before the first reading of each text.

#### Paper 4 (Oral Communication)

This paper comprises two parts which are not linked thematically.

<u>Part 1 (Reading Aloud)</u>: Candidates read aloud a text to suit the purpose, audience and context of a given situation.

<u>Part 2 (Stimulus-based Conversation)</u>: Candidates engage in a conversation with the Examiners on a topic based on a photo stimulus.
